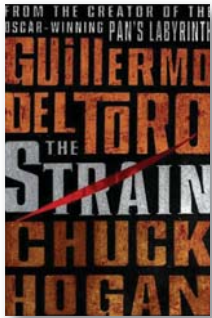

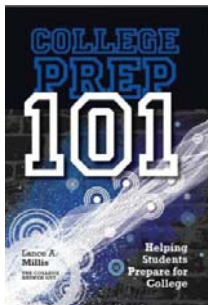

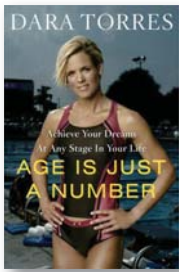

## "The Yankee Years"

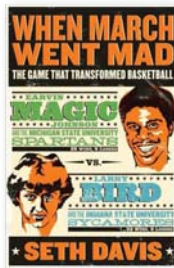

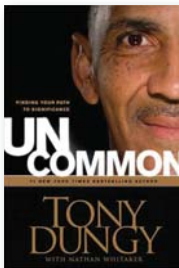
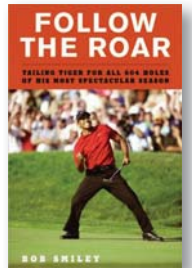

**Bob Smiley**

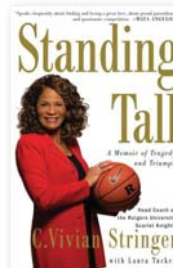

**Matt McCarthy**

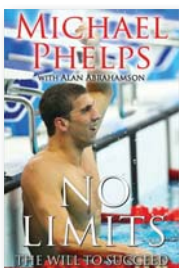
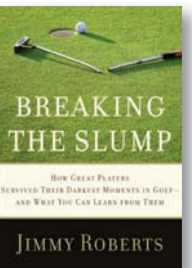

**Jimmy Roberts**

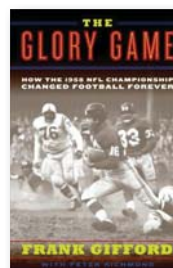

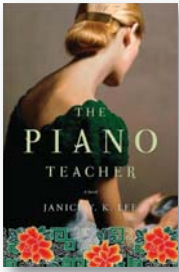


## "The Glory Game"

## “The Piano Teacher”

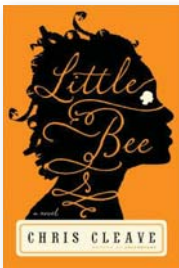
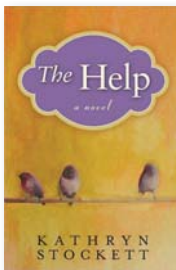
Janice Y.K. Lee
